3. Update from Adult and Children Advisory Committee Members

The adult and children advisory committees did not meet today. A status update was provided by the adult and children service providers and education representative.

Hope Haven adult day services are closed, supported employment services largely are closed, twenty-four-hour residential services homes are operating, but closed to visitors and people are not allowed to go on home visits or outside events without special permission. Hope Haven support services provided in homes in the community have decreased as people become more fearful of the virus. Hope Haven is looking for personal protection equipment. There is a need financial help from state or federal government but there is no financial help so far. Providers who are able to are providing hazard pay.

Christamore Family Treatment Center residential services are operating. They have implemented no visits and not allowing people into the facility other than employees. Young House outpatient services are provided via electronic means. Clients and staff like the electronic services and want those to continue.

Schools are closed until April 30th and students aren't likely to return to school this school year. Mid-Prairie Community Schools received approval to have required learning. This will be for ninth through twelfth grade so students can obtain the credits required to graduate. Up to this point schools could provide learning material for students to work on, but not require them to do the work. Some schools are providing meals for students and hot spots for families who don't have internet access.

4. Consider Approval of Claims as per Running Totals Document- March

All reports were received from the county auditors, however, Keokuk County still needs to submit the county ledger report. March expenditures included the typical administration fees, jail diversion and advocate expenses. Lee County made their final payment to the fiscal agent in the amount of \$488,485.76. Other revenues included an interim assistance reimbursement in the amount of \$29,327.17, a distribution payment from Washington County and property taxes. Property tax payments have been extended without penalty, which means property tax payments will continue through April and May.
